The Wessels House is listed on the Saratoga Heritage Resources Inventory, included as a part of HP-99-02. It qualified under Criteria c and e:

- c) the property embodies distinctive characteristics of Eclectic Revival styles of the period.; and
- e) the property embodies unique physical characteristics representing an established and familiar visual feature of a neighborhood.

The Wessels House does not appear eligible for the California Register of Historical Resources, as it lacks adequate integrity to the original design, and does not distinctively represent the era in which it was built.




