



Historical Background

Early ownership of this property has not been determined, however, an early owner of the property was Julia McLean who sold it to E.M. Goss in 1905. Later owners were Roy T. and Mary F. Caldwell who sold the property to Cecil and Madeleine Lyle in 1944. Lyle sold the property to Elaine Miletich, who sold it to Jeanne Hainich in 1975.

Integrity

Altered with replacement window sash and siding, the house retains only some of its character-defining architectural design, workmanship and materials. The house maintains its historic location and setting within Saratoga Village, and the property represents only some of the historical associations and feelings of this residence.
