



Historical Background

This circa-1895 residence is one of the last structures of its style in the Saratoga Village area. The house was originally located on a corner site at Oak Street and Saratoga-Los Gatos Road, but was relocated to accommodate the construction of the Village Library in 1927. The new parcel was a 50' x 150' rectangular lot that ran from Lumber Street (now Big Basin Way) along Sixth Street. This property changed ownership several times before 1944, when the rear 50' x 50' portion (on which this house sits) was subdivided off by the Hales. It was named the Nardie House in recent times. The house was rehabilitated in 1987, converting it from a residence to an office.

Integrity

Although altered with a new raised garage at the ground floor, the house retains adequate character-defining architectural design, workmanship and materials, as well as a historic location and residential setting, and the property continues to represent the historical associations and feelings of this house.
